

Teaching Faculty Award for the Support of Information Literacy

The Steelman Library is pleased to present the Information Literacy Teaching Faculty Award for the Support of Information Literacy. The award is given to a Southeastern University teaching faculty member who has contributed consistently and notably to the promotion of information literacy at Southeastern University. The award allows the library to recognize outstanding faculty contributions to our information literacy goals and initiatives. Any member of the Southeastern University teaching faculty is eligible; a previous recipient will be eligible five years after the earlier award.

Nomination Process

The nominator should use the Nomination Form to describe how the nominee meets the criteria below. Nominations are welcome from faculty, administration, staff and students. Nominations should be set to Grace Veach before the deadline.

Criteria

- Works actively and effectively to support the library
- Promotes the role of the library as an essential component of Southeastern University's mission
- Works in partnership with librarians to promote information literacy in teaching and research

Although all criteria are pertinent, one does not have to meet all the qualifications to be nominated.

Selection Committee

The selection committee shall be comprised of the Southeastern University Faculty Librarians, the Library Dean, and the winner of the award from the previous year. The selection committee reserves the right to decline presentation of the Award if no suitable candidate is found.

- Stipend
