

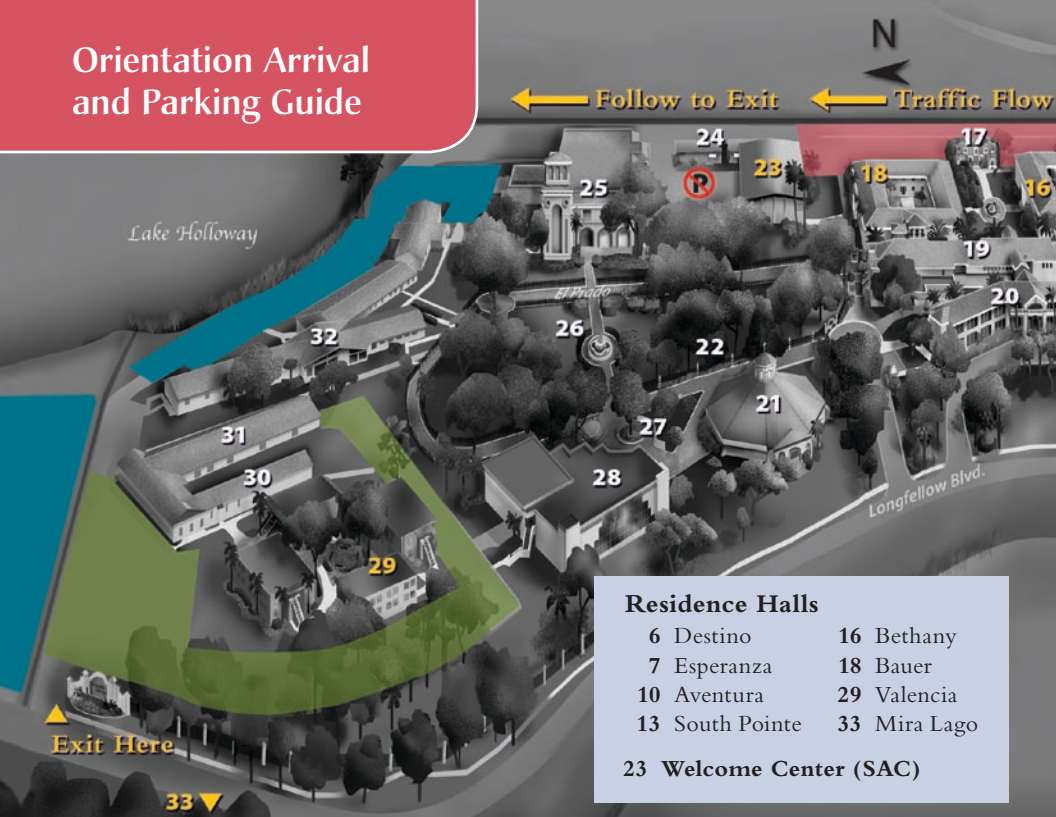

Welcome to Southeastern University!

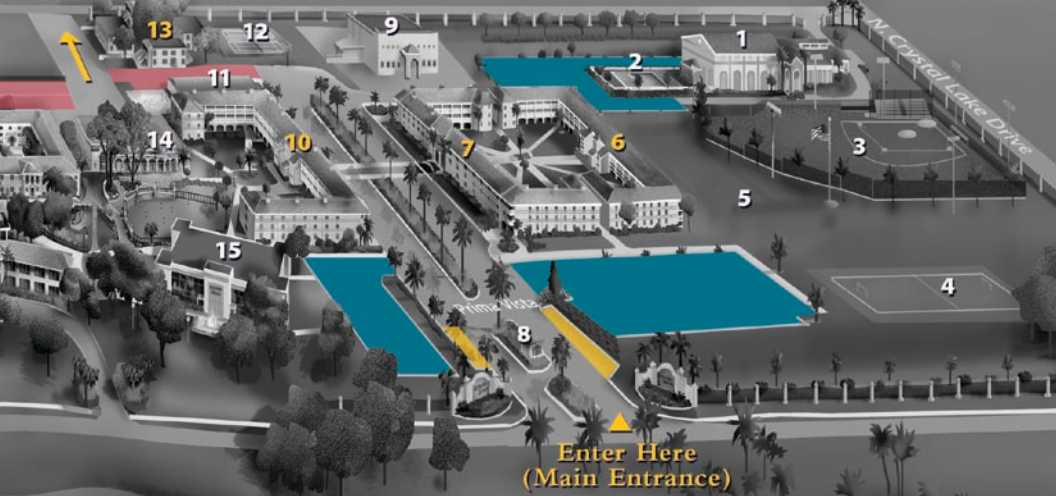
We are delighted that you are coming to Southeastern University! To reduce congestion on Saturday, August 22, we ask that students whose last names begin with A–L arrive between 8:00 and 10:00 A.M. and students whose last names begin with M–Z arrive between 10:00 A.M. and 12:00 noon. All new residential students must check in at their assigned residence hall (without luggage) before reporting to the Welcome Center (Student Activities Center). At your residence hall, you will receive a Room Access Confirmation Form that will affirm your check-in and admit you to the Welcome Center for required registration procedures. All new commuter students should report directly to the Welcome Center.

If you are a residential student and have not received your housing assignment or do not know what it is, go first to the Housing Office, which on August 22, will be located in the Cypress Room, Pansler Hall second floor, for your convenience. Then, check-in at your residence hall.

Step 1 – Parking Due to construction projects, most parking will be in lots on Longfellow Blvd. immediately north of the fenced campus areas. When you arrive on campus, please park in the north lots and take a shuttle (or walk) to your residence hall to check-in without your luggage. To avoid blocking access, please do not park along any curb or in any area not marked for parking.

Step 2 – Housing Check-In After parking and leaving your luggage in the car, if you have received a residence hall assignment, report to the check-in station of your residence hall (listed on the next page). You will be shown your room, asked to review and sign a room inventory sheet, and given a **Room Access Confirmation Form**, which allows residential students entry to the Welcome Center, where you will receive your Fire Card.

Step 3 – Welcome Center Registration In the Welcome Center, you will receive your Personalized Checklist and visit the registration stations required for you. **Every student must visit the ID Station to receive a Fire Card (student ID). The Fire Card is your library access, meal card, student account card, and room access key. Your Fire Card will admit you to the residence halls' unloading zones as described below.**

Step 4 – Unloading After receiving your Fire Card, you may drive to the unloading zone for your residence hall and put your belonging in your room. Immediately after unloading, please move your car to the north lots or any available parking space (blue). No cars may be parked or left unattended in unloading zones (red zones on the campus map). If your housing assignment is in Valencia or Mira Lago, you may enter through the North Entrance to park in the Valencia/Mira Lago parking lot (green zones).

Step 5 – Information Central Visit Bush Chapel for information on academic degree programs, student activities, and community organizations. Open a Wachovia bank account. Sign up for intramural sports. Learn about studying in Jerusalem. And much more!

Step 6 – Complete All Orientation Steps The Orientation Guide that follows contains all the instructions for your orientation to Southeastern University and events throughout the week. Please read carefully for all of the information for students and parents so you can enjoy a great beginning at Southeastern University.

Student Worship Department and Ministry Arts Tour Teams

The Student Worship Department & Ministry Arts Tour Teams offer students an opportunity to receive practical training in different areas of music ministry. The vision of the Student Worship Department is to train, mentor and equip a new generation of worship leaders that will be challenged to change the world through principles of servant-hood, relationship building and musical training that will develop excellence in their respective strengths.



The SWD coordinates the worship that takes place for all campus services including regular SEU chapels (Tuesday–Friday), along with any special events such as our annual Fire Fall Revival service. Anyone who is interested in leading worship on campus, or just being part of a team, should plan on joining our department for weekly prayer meetings and mentoring sessions with the Director. The Student Worship Department is a powerful resource for connecting a new generation of worship leaders to the local body of Christ through networking opportunities. Pastors from all around

the nation come to us when in need of a Worship Arts/Music Pastor because of the intense training associated with our department.

The Ministry Arts Tour Teams offer a variety of scholarship-based opportunities for students gifted in the areas of singing or playing. The MATT department currently has four main teams that travel on a consistent basis to churches, youth conventions, various conferences and district councils around the nation. The Southeastern Singers are the primary, elite traveling group from SEU that offers a variety of scholarships for vocalists, instrumentalists, Public Relations & Promotions assistants and an Audio/Tech Crew. Network Logon Instructions—Activate Your Account

Before you begin you must activate your student account. Browse to <http://psync.seuniversity.edu/> and enter your username. You will be required to verify your account by answering three personal questions. Once you have answered your personal questions, you will be able to set your new password.

Your username will be your first initial, middle initial and full last name. Example: If your name is Jim Albert Smith, then your username will be “jasmith”.

Your e-mail address will be your username@seuniversity.edu. Example: If your username is jasmith then your e-mail address will be jasmith@seuniversity.edu. You can check your e-mail at <https://webmail.seuniversity.edu>.

Phone Number Assignments

During the check-in process, please see your Resident Director to get your assigned phone number. Every room has one phone number with two phone jacks.

On-Campus Voice Mail Set-Up Instructions

Every dorm phone number has two voice mailboxes associated with it. The numbers of the voice mailboxes are the last 4 digits of your phone number with a 1 or 2 after it. If your number is 667.5555, the two voice mail numbers are 55551 and 55552.

To Set Up your Voice Mail

1. Dial 5158 on your phone to access the voice mail system.
2. Type in your Voice mailbox number and press #.
(Example: If your phone number is 669.4423, then you would enter 44231# or 44232#).
3. Type in the Temporary password 111.
4. Follow the voice prompts to record your name, message, and change your password to at least a 5-digit number.
5. To check your voice mail, repeat steps 1–4, but use your new password. For any questions or problems regarding voice mail or network problems, please call the Information Technology Help Desk at 667.5028 or via e-mail at helpdesk@seuniversity.edu.
