History of Southeastern University

Southeastern University was founded in 1935 by the Assemblies of God Alabama District Superintendent J.C. Thames and other Southeastern District leaders. Originally named the Alabama Shield of Faith Institute, it was renamed the South-Eastern Bible Institute (SEBI) in 1936. Guy Shields was the first president.

Originally located in a former high school building in New Brockton, Alabama, the school opened its doors to students on November 4, 1935, under the direction of four faculty members. Two years later, on May 22, 1937, the first graduation exercises were held. Seventeen students received diplomas for the two-year academic program.

SEBI continued classes in New Brockton until 1940 when a decision was made to consolidate the school with Beulah Heights Bible Institute in Atlanta, Georgia. The school was known from 1940 to 1942 as the Beulah Heights-South-Eastern Bible Institute. In the fall of 1942, Rev. Ralph Byrd allowed the school to relocate to his congregation at 301-7 Capital Ave., SW in Atlanta, where it then was once again named the South-Eastern Bible Institute.

In 1946, the board of directors voted to secure a permanent location for the full development of the school. A new campus location was purchased later that year in Lakeland, Florida. The Atlanta campus was sold, and development of the new site began. From 1946 to 1952, SEBI was located at the Lodwick School of Aeronautics in Lakeland. In 1952, the school moved to its present location at Longfellow Blvd.





Student body growth continued at the new central Florida campus along with the academic programs. SEBI became South-Eastern Bible College in 1956 when four-year Bachelor of Arts degree programs began. After adding education degrees, the college's board of directors changed the school name to Southeastern College of the Assemblies of God in 1977.

In 1986, Southeastern was granted regional accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges. This accreditation was reaffirmed in 1991, 2001 and 2011.

In 2005, Southeastern College officially became Southeastern University, began offering its first master's degree programs and formed the Colleges of Arts & Sciences, Business, Christian Ministries & Religion, and Education. Since then, the university has also formed the Colleges of Behavioral & Social Sciences and Natural & Health Sciences and, in 2014, began offering doctoral programs.

What began in 1935 as a Bible-training school is now the largest Assemblies of God educational institution in America, producing future Christian leaders in the fields of church ministries, education, medicine, law, business, communication, psychology, social work, literature and music.



Points of Excellence

Campus Growth

Since 2011, SEU has added more than 400,000 square feet of educational, residential and student-services space to its Lakeland campus. Most recently, in 2020, the 31,200-square-foot Welcome Center opened along Longfellow Boulevard as the official “front door” to the university.

The university also recently acquired 36 acres of land a short distance from the campus. The land will be used for future development of the Southeastern University athletic facilities, with a championship tennis facility, soccer fields, and baseball stadium all possible at the site.

The Kern Family Foundation awarded SEU with a \$2.1 million grant to develop an innovative degree program in the Barnett College of Ministry and Theology. This grant is the largest ever awarded to the university to date.

Enrollment Growth

Southeastern has been recognized by The Chronicle of Higher Education as one of the nation’s fastest-growing private, non-profit, master’s institutions. From 2009-2019 enrollment has increased 235.4%.

New Programs

This academic year has brought in a number of new programs offered across all delivery methods. A total of six certificates, one bachelor’s degree, one master’s degree, and four concentrations have been added.



Alumni Relations

Dr. David Docusen '01, '15 (MAML), '19 (D.Min.) is using his book, “Neighborliness: Finding the Beauty of God Across Dividing Lines,” to work with churches across America and encourage holistic community development. He helps create practical strategies for bringing racial and economic justice to communities with high poverty levels.

Faith “Dani” Nawara '10 works for Facebook in the HR and Crisis Incident Management program. As an HR project manager, she provides assistance to employees adjusting to the COVID-19 pandemic and transitioning back to their offices and helps prepare the company for future crises.

Larry Taylor '16, '18 (MBA) founded Vertical Vision, a global outreach program that combines his love of basketball with his passion for people and mentoring. In the summers of 2018 and 2019, he hosted a series of basketball camps in Guangzhou, China. He plans to expand his program and host a camp in the Philippines.

Heather Brinckerhoff '12 is the head of social media marketing for QVC. Previously, she worked as the director of social media for Magnolia, a company owned by HGTV stars Chip and Joanna Gaines. Additionally, she has held positions with Disney, PlayStation, and LEGOLAND.

Andrew Viator '05 is the founder and CEO of Viator Design and Construction. Using his position in the marketplace as an outlet for ministry, he does both commercial and residential work and builds furniture and production equipment.

Blake Thomas '15 is the director of intercultural programs at Westmont College. He oversees and advises six intercultural organizations and contributes to numerous committees that address race and unity on campus. He aims to build bridges, foster trust and provide support for students of color.

Athletic News

Fire Athletics had the most success it ever has on the national scene during the 2020-21 academic year.

In addition to winning The Sun Conference Commissioner's Cup for the second time in program history and becoming the first to do so with a perfect score, Southeastern also posted its highest IMG Learfield Director's Cup finish at sixth.

The Fire won the men's and women's cross country, indoor track and field, and outdoor track and field conference championships and picked up the regular season and tournament titles in baseball, women's soccer, and women's basketball.

In March, history was made at the NAIA Indoor Track and Field National Championships as well as the Wrestling National Championships with the Fire winning three individual titles in one weekend. In Sioux Falls, the Women's 4x400 Meter Relay team of Yuriah Bigos, Miyah Ford, Namiah Simpson, and Courtney Gales cruised to victory in a time of 3:53 to earn the program's first individual national championship.

Meanwhile in Wichita, SEU wrestlers Andreus Bond and Kyle Kirkham became the first two Fire wrestlers to advance to a title match. Bond avenged his conference championship loss just two weeks earlier to win the 149-pound national championship and win the program's first title. Just moments later, Kyle Kirkham scored a takedown at the buzzer in his final match with the Fire to secure the 165-pound title.

The track and field success continued into the outdoor season with sophomore Jaqual Bush winning the program's first individual title in the Women's 200 Meters in a time of 23.5. Both the men's and women's teams posted fifth-place finishes in the team standings.



Baseball, women's soccer, women's basketball, and both cross country teams competed in the NAIA National Championships with Southeastern playing host to opening rounds for all but cross country and the Fire advancing to the final site in each tournament.

In total, Fire student-athletes won 192 All-Conference awards, 96 conference scholar-athlete awards, five Champion of Character awards, 54 All-America honors, and five Academic All-Americans.

Southeastern University Head Athletic Trainer BJ Geasa was voted as The Sun Conference Athletic Trainer of the Year and the NAIA's Athletic Trainer of the Year for his service to the profession and Fire Athletics during an unprecedented season of college athletics during the Covid-19 pandemic. Athletic Director Drew Watson (AD of the Year) and Assistant AD for Athletic Communications Donnie Smith (SID of the Year) were recognized by The Sun Conference as well.

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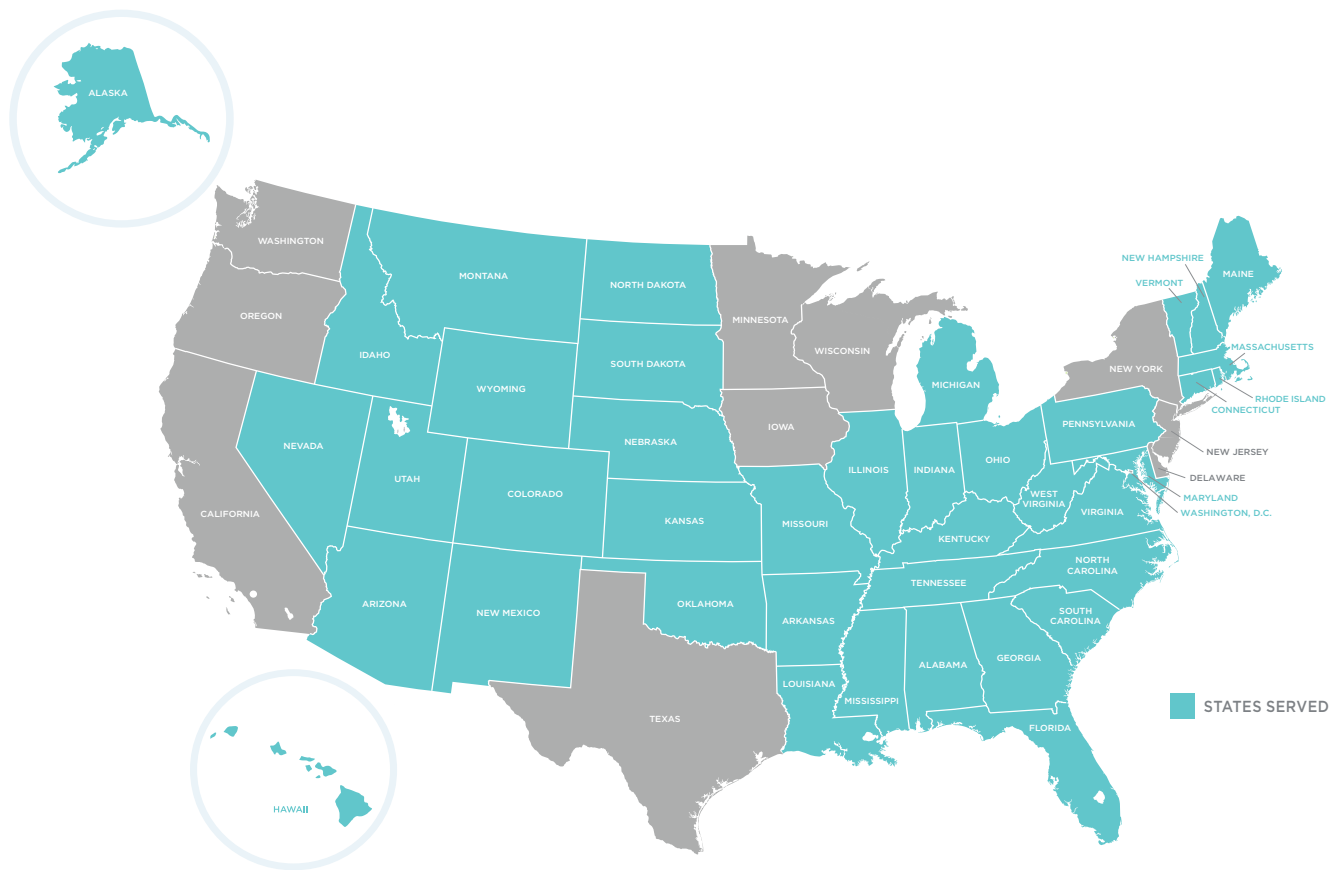


Missions

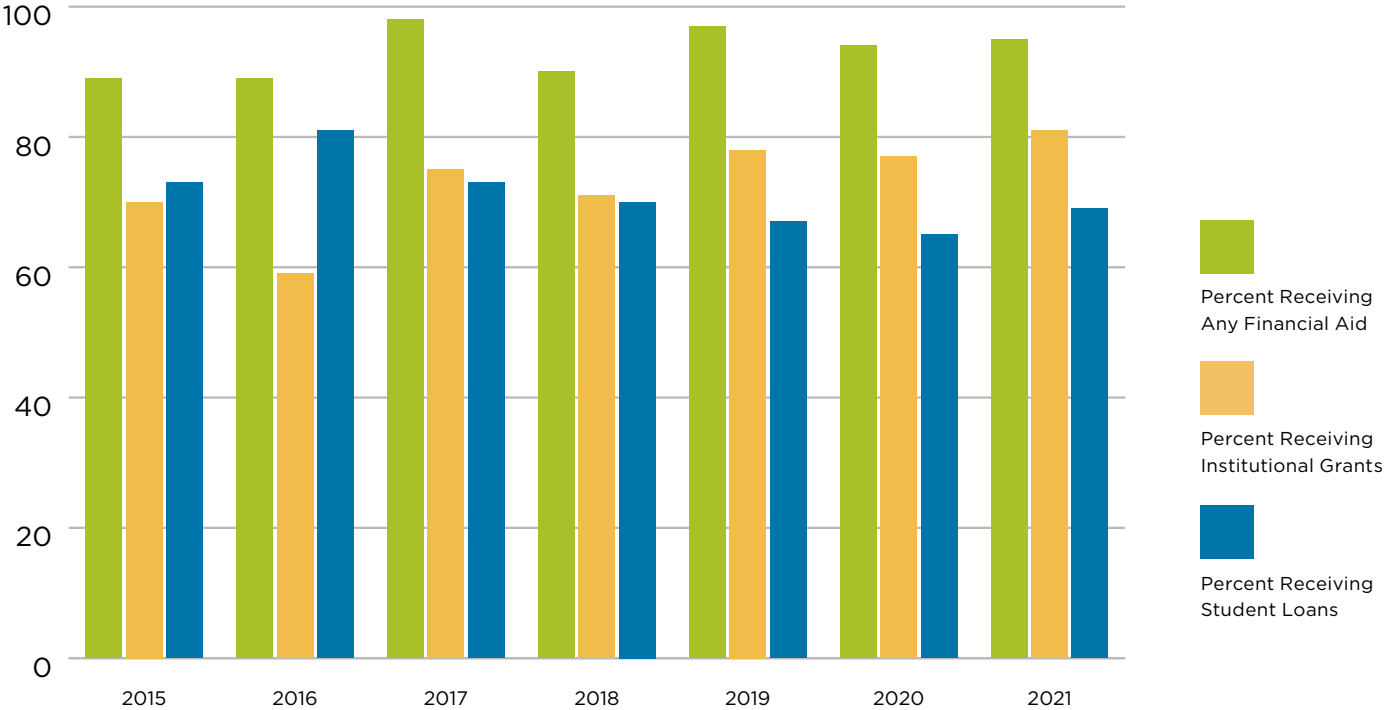

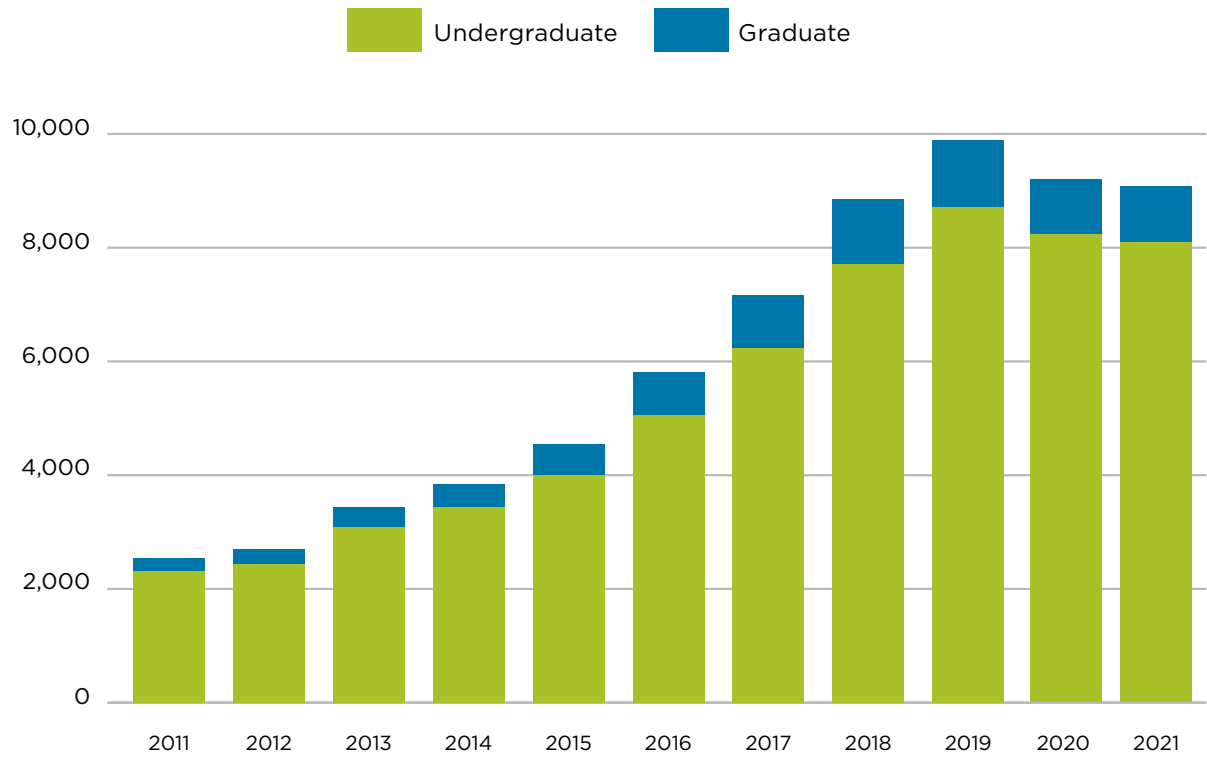

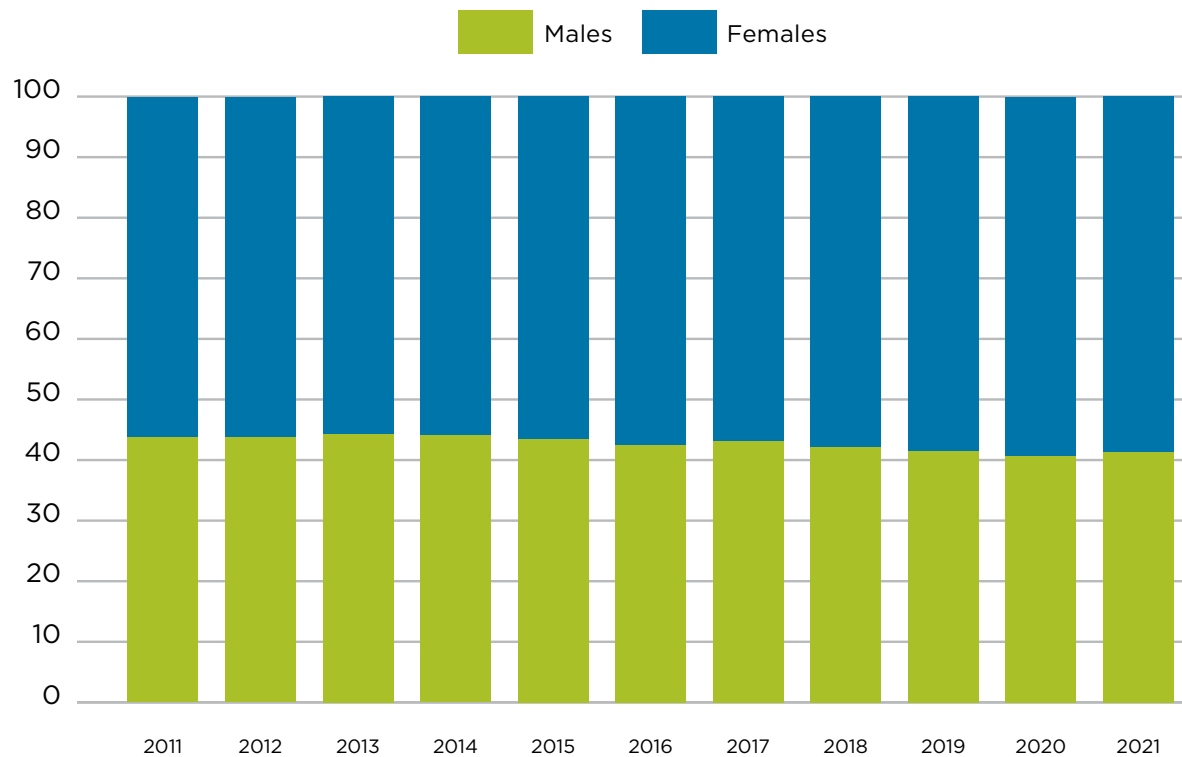

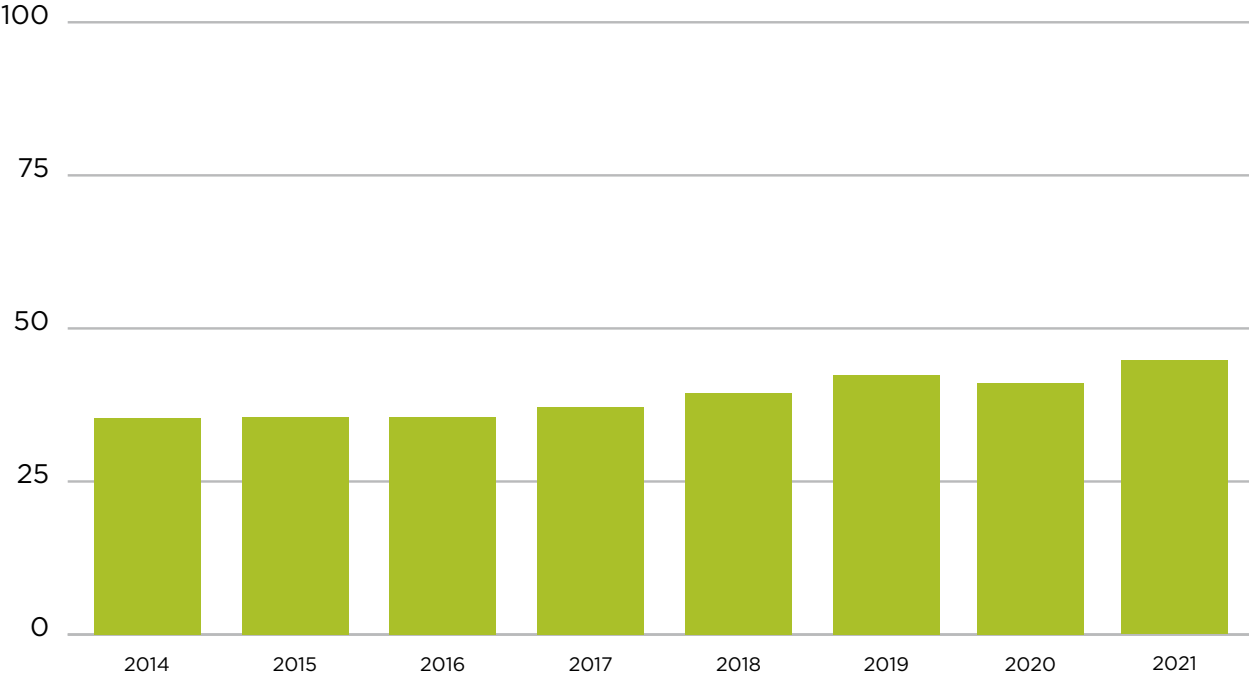

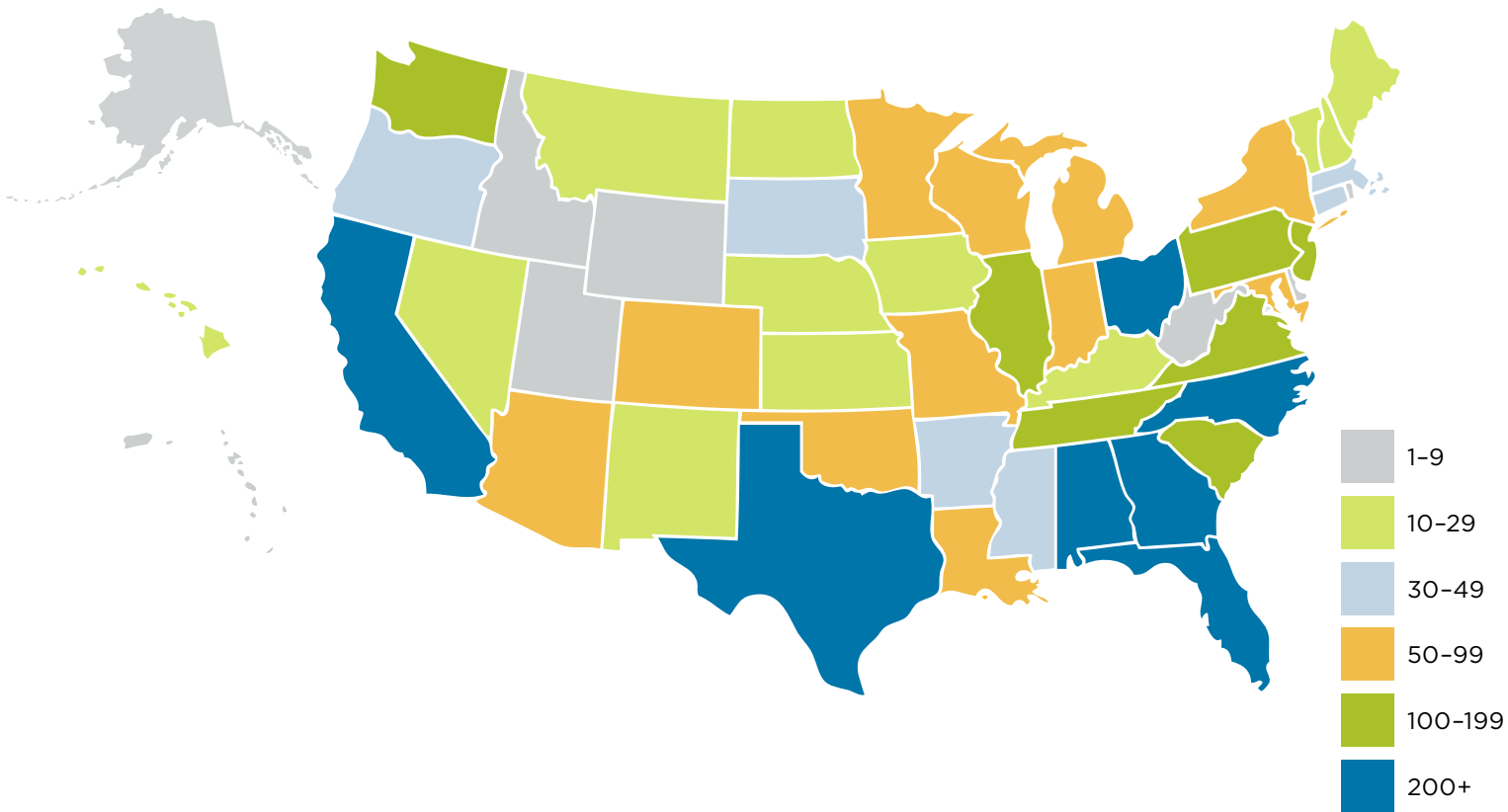

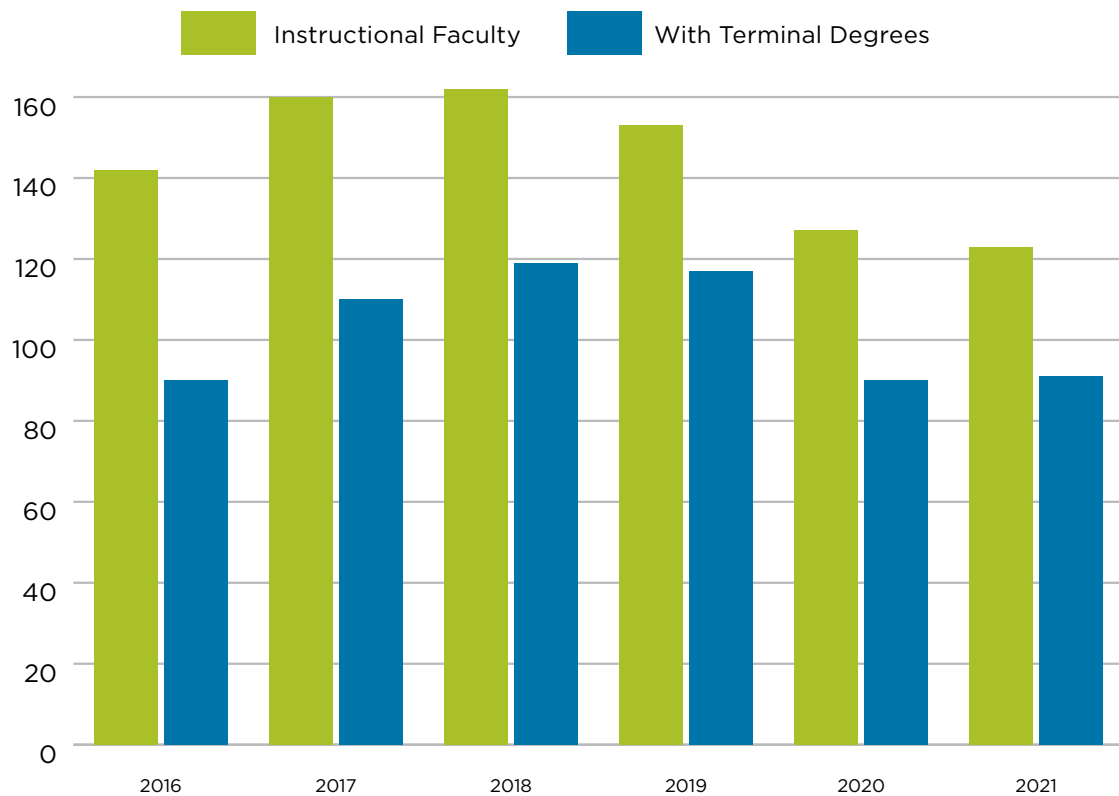
PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL FACULTY WITH TERMINAL DEGREES
